The urbanism that reclaimed public space became a means of control, the police who made streets safe became an occupying army, technology went from a means to the end. public spaces, it's clear that what brought the city back—proximity, density, and human exchange—are what sent Covid-19 burning through its streets, and the price of order has come due.
