Friction causes electrons to get bumped out of place with the object that holds them stronger gaining more. The more electrons gained, the more negative the charge. The object that lost those electrons will be equally positive. The net of the two objects will still be neutral. An electron has a charge of -1.6 x 10-19 Coulombs. You will use this value when problems give you a number of electrons and rather that a charge in an electrostatics problem.
