Number one, he would regret his entire life. Number two, he would want to live his life over again. And he would die. "This didn't make me a writer, but provided the incentive to discover that I am a writer." So, during this time of bad health, he returned to Brooklyn, started to drink and take drugs and wrote his first book *Last Exit to Brooklyn* which he finished after six years and was published in the US in 1964.
