that. But no, it really is totally down to earth. You see what I did there. Anyway, there are just two aliens in the whole book and only one of them features in the action. The rest is all humans and it all takes place here on Earth. The aliens are only there as a literary device. They could have been Buddhist monks but that wouldn't work because ... well, read the story and you will see. So, if it isn't science fiction, then what is it? Good question. I can say for sure that it is not a crime thriller or a love story (although there is a tiny hint of romance). Apart from that, it is sort of all genres and none at all. You will find in these pages, politics, philosophy, religion, atheism,

feminism, racism, fascism, love, war, death, social justice, sex, terrorism ... and a cry across the aeons from an antediluvian civilisation. This is a story about our society and the mistakes we are making but it is also about the personal journey that each of us must take in order to evolve as individuals and, from that, as a species. The story revolves around a would-be terrorist and his intended victims.

We look at what brought him to the place where he thought killing was a good idea. More than that, we explore why it really isn't a good idea, the true consequences of his actions and his alternatives. Furthermore, it is commentary on the polarisation of society around politics,

belief and thought. The book explores this division and gives a clear warning about the dangers of binary thinking. The central characters give a starting point for fixing things but do not provide answers. The point of this story is to hold a mirror and allow us to see ourselves and what we are making of our time here on earth. Because, after all, no one gets out alive.

French Intellectuals, 1944-1956 *Univ of California Press*
The uniquely prominent role of

French intellectuals in European cultural and political life following World War II is the focus of Tony Judt's newest book. He analyzes this intellectual community's most divisive conflicts: how to respond to the promise and the betrayal of Communism and how to sustain a commitment to radical ideals when confronting the hypocrisy in Stalin's Soviet Union, in the new Eastern European Communist states, and in France itself. Judt shows why this was an all-consuming moral dilemma to a generation of French men and women, how their responses were conditioned by war and occupation, and how post-war political

choices have come to sit uneasily on the conscience of later generations of French intellectuals. Judt's analysis extends beyond the writings of fashionable "Existentialist" personalities such as Jean-Paul Sartre, Albert Camus, and Simone de Beauvoir to include a wide intellectual community of Catholic philosophers, non-aligned journalists, literary critics and poets, Communist and non-Communist alike. Judt treats the intellectual dilemmas of the postwar years as an unfinished history. French intellectuals have not fully come to terms with the gnawing sense of what Judt calls the "moral irresponsibility" of those years. The result, he suggests, is a

legacy of bad faith and confusion that has damaged France's cultural standing, notably in newly liberated Eastern Europe, and which reflects the nation's larger difficulty in confronting its own ambivalent past.

"frontier" town, she recovered from a misjudged marriage, learned to write journalism and fiction and drama, took on the fight for feminism and racial justice and conservation long before those causes became popular, and embarked on a long and uncommonly successful voyage into self-understanding. Way before women did this sort of thing, she recognized her own need for solitude and independence, and built her own little house away from town in an area called Coconut Grove.
