Decades later, a boy named Pete Saubers finds the treasure, and now it is Pete and his family that Bill Hodges, Holly Gibney, and Jerome Robinson must rescue from the ever-more deranged and vengeful Morris when he’s released from prison after thirty-five years. Not since *Misery* has King played with the notion of a reader whose obsession with a writer gets dangerous. *Finders Keepers* is spectacular, heart-pounding suspense, but it is also King writing about how literature shapes a life—for good, for bad, forever.
